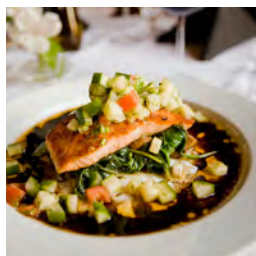
Switch it Up with Spirits

Wine-Focused Eateries in Park City

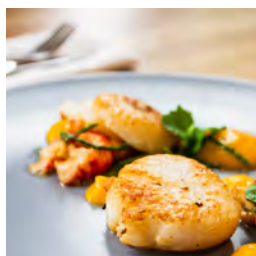


Park City is home to some of the best restaurants around the globe. Many of them have unbelievable wine programs that match their menus to perfection. If you love a good meal made even better by an extraordinary glass of wine, these Park City favorites are not to be missed:



Riverhorse on Main

This upscale establishment has been wowing guests and critics for decades. Riverhorse on Main received the coveted Forbes Travel Guide Four Star Award 16 years in a row. As if that wasn't impressive enough, it's also the proud recipient of the distinguished DiRōNA award. Executive chef and co-owner Seth Adams creates seasonal dishes that show off the best of Utah bounty. Riverhorse's wine cellar houses wine from Napa to Hungary, Italy to Utah, and everywhere in between.



Café Terigo

Old World vibes and tasty Italian food keep visitors coming back for more at Cafe Terigo. Located in a gorgeous brick building, bedecked in cafe lights, this local favorite makes everyone feel at home. Their wine list is extensive, so there is something for everyone. However, their Italian red selections are extraordinary. You'll also find classic cuisine like homemade ricotta, bolognese pasta, and smoked chicken fettuccine.



Butcher's Chop House

Butcher's is one of Park City's top, old-school steak houses. This is the place for you if you want a juicy cut of prime rib slathered in garlic butter. In addition to perfectly prepared steaks, they also serve up surprising dishes like lobster nachos, seared mahi-mahi, and even coconut curry risotto. Their wine list is impressive and offers limited selections of "off-menu" wines. Ask your server for their secret wine stash and prepare to be amazed.

While you're indulging in your weekend wine getaway, make room on your itinerary for some quintessential Park City fun.



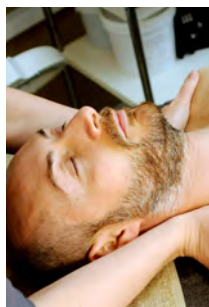
Atticus:
